Cleaning the Community



On Saturday, June 26th, nine (9) Emerging Leaders, two (2) AmeriCorps members, Program Coordinator, and Program Director participated in a paint party at Artist People in East Brunswick, NJ. In the month of June we received the amazing news that our Perth Amboy High School student from the Youth Entrepreneurship Program (YEP), Karissa Rodriguez, won second place in the **NFTE North East Regional Competition**, and will be moving forward to the National Competition. Karissa's invention is an app called SIDEKICK which is geared towards supporting victims of domestic violence, and sexual assault. Additionally, Regional Winner and National Runner Up from last year, Charlize Leon (a current Junior at Perth Amboy High School), won the IEY 2021 Entrepreneur of the Year Scholarship Award. The hard work of both Karissa and Charlize definitely paid off.

The JRF is very proud of all our YEP students! In the month of

May, the program initially found out that three of our Perth Amboy High School students from YEP made it to the semi-final (top 13) in the competition. The students from YEP worked extremely hard over the past months, and it showed with how far they made it in the competition. This program is facilitated by our Program Assistant, Precious Ojeda, who has done an incredibly amazing job supporting our students in this process.

Neighborhood Cleanup

PAAC collaborated with the Perth Amboy Clean Communities and the City of Perth Amboy to be part of a citywide event. Sanitation materials, giveaways and t-shirts were given to all who participated.

In addition to the cleanup, PAAC also organized a neighborhood *Ice Cream Meet Up* at Francis Street Park with the Perth Amboy Police Department to talk with residents about community policing and public safety issues. Residents once again enjoyed refreshments and ice cream from Fajji's, while having an open and honest discussion with our officers.

PAAC Neighborhood NRTC Planning

The PAAC team also came together with neighbors and stakeholders to facilitate several conversations on the PAAC Neighborhood NRTC Plan, which can be found on the JRF website. This new plan lays out strategies and projects designed to improve our PAAC Neighborhood over the next 10 years. On June 16, PAAC held a neighborhood meeting to discuss the overall vision. Refreshments, snacks and ice cream were served, and the plan was explained in great detail with a final survey at the end to gather the opinions of the residents.



In addition to the PAAC Neighborhood meeting, the PAAC team met with the PAAC Host Team, and Mayor Caba, of the City of Perth Amboy, to get feedback on the plan. The PAAC Team worked very hard constructing this plan over the past year; submitting the final version to the NJ Department of Community Affairs in June. The heart of the plan is reflective of what is truly important to our community, based on the input gathered from all who live, work or play in the PAAC Neighborhood!



Senior Wellness Club

This summer the PAAC Team also welcomed back the "Senior Wellness Club"! With the closing of the JRF Silver Linings Program, PAAC held an introduction program on July 14 at the PAAC Community Garden, where they welcomed the former participants of Silver Linings and several others.

Seniors gathered and received a tour of the community garden, learned about program changes and provided feedback about the type of events they would like to see implemented. Pizza from Stella's Pizza, located on Hall Ave in Perth Amboy, was served for lunch, activities took place and the seniors took home books.
